Journals, magazines, newspaper, newsletter & blogs

- Periodicals are published on an ongoing basis.
- Journals are academic or scholarly in nature and are usually peer-reviewed or refereed.
- Magazines may also have a specialist subject but its' content is aimed at the general public and is not peer-reviewed.
- Newspapers tend to contain short articles on current events. Treat websites of individual newspapers like the New York Times and digital copies of print newspapers as periodicals. Treat articles from a news website CNN or ABC like webpages.
- A Newsletter is collection of short articles of interest to members of a particular community.
- A blog is a regularly updated website or web page, typically one run by an individual or small group that is written in an informal or conversational style.

Author: Who is responsible for the work?

Individual author/s format: **Author, A. A., & Author, A. A.**

Use the author's surname and initials, use a comma to separate multiple authors.

Use the & for the last author.

End this element with a full stop.

Works with more than 20 authors

For a work with up to 20 authors, include all of the names in the reference. When the work has 21 or more authors, include only the first 19 names, an ellipsis, and the final name.

Corporate or organisational author format: **Name or organisation.**

The author may be an organisation, write exactly as shown using capitals.

eg. NSW Department of Health. or Amnesty International.

Write your author/s or editor/s here:

Date: When was the work published?

Date of publication journal format: (Year). (2019).

Date of publication magazine & newsletter format: (Year, Month Day).

Provide as much of the information that is available. (2018, October 7). or (2018, October).

Date of publication newspaper & blog format: (Year, Month Day). (2018, October 7).

If you do not have a publication date then use (n.d.). instead.

End this element with a full stop.

Write your year of publication here:

Title: What is this work called?

Article title format: Title: Subtitle. (NOTE: the article title is **NOT** in italics.)

The title is written in sentence case. Capitalise only the first word of the title, subtitle, and any proper nouns.

Working partnership with parents: The experience and challenge of practice innovation in child and family health nursing.

Write your title here:

Source: Where can I retrieve this work?

The source format for a periodical article: *Journal Title*, Volume(issue), page range. DOI OR URL of if applicable

Journal of Clinical Nursing, 21(22), 3246-3255. <https://doi.org/10.1111/j.1365-2702.2011.03772.x>

The name of the periodical is in *italics*. Capitalise all words except joining words like 'and' & 'of'.

End the name of the periodical with a comma. The volume number is in *italics*.

If a DOI (Digital Object Identifier) is available for an online article then add this after the page range.

Do **not** end with a full stop.

Journal articles:

Include a DOI if available. **Only add** the database name and URL if the database is the creator of the content or provides access to works of limited circulation. Articles from the library database EBSCO or Proquest do not require you to add the database name. Note some nursing databases create their own content.

Magazine articles:

Add a DOI if available, only add the URL for an online article that is not available anywhere else. If the volume and issue numbers are not available, then omit them.

Blog posts:

Include the blog name in *italics* followed by the URL of the post. Omit volume, issue and page number elements.

Format of a Journal article, add a DOI if available:

Author Surname, Initial(s). (Year). Article title: Subtitle. *Journal Title*, Volume(issue), page range. DOI OR URL of if applicable
